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

# Postoperative Infection after Total Hip Arthroplasty

The proportion of patients with an infection at the surgical area after primary total hip arthroplasty

Definitions

- Primary total hip arthroplasty: A surgery performed for patients with degenerative arthritis at the hip joint or
  osteonecrosis of femoral head. The damaged joint surface is removed and the joint is reconstructed using a
  prosthesis.
- Postoperative infection: The infection at the surgical site after total hip arthroplasty.



### . Interpretation

 The rate of postoperative infection is one of the most serious complications after primary total hip arthroplasty, and it has been shown to be very low at ≤0.3% in the past 5 years.

#### Improvement

- Thorough infection management.

## Postoperative Dislocation after Total Hip Arthroplasty

The proportion of patients showing a joint dislocation after primary total hip arthroplasty

### Definitions

Primary total hip arthroplasty: A surgery performed for patients with degenerative arthritis at the hip joint or
osteonecrosis of femoral head. The damaged joint surface is removed and the joint is reconstructed using a
prosthesis.

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 Postoperative dislocation: A case where the prosthesis is dislocated from the inserted position after total hip arthroplasty.



### 📥 Interpretation

 The rate of postoperative dislocation is one of the most serious complications after primary total hip arthroplasty. It was shown to be very low at < 2%. In 2022, it was 0.2%.</li>

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Appropriate surgical procedure.
